BOEING: the company will match gifts between \$25 and \$6,000.

Boeing also provides grants to nonprofits where employees dedicate their time. For every 25 hours a Boeing employee volunteers he or she can request a \$250 grant. Plus the company provides \$100 grants as a way to recognize employees who participate in fundraising walks, bikes, and runs.

MICROSOFT: within the last two years, Microsoft has increased its **matching gift maximum** from an already impressive \$12,000 to a tremendous **\$15,000**.

To make things even better, Microsoft also has a **volunteer grant program where the company donates \$25 to organizations for every hour its employees volunteer** and provides each new employee with a small grant to allocate to a nonprofit of his or her choosing.

STARBUCKS: offers a matching gift program where the company **matches up to \$1,500 in donations per employee each year.** Full-time, part-time, and retired employees are eligible for the program.
